THE MODERN PULVERTAFT FAMILY

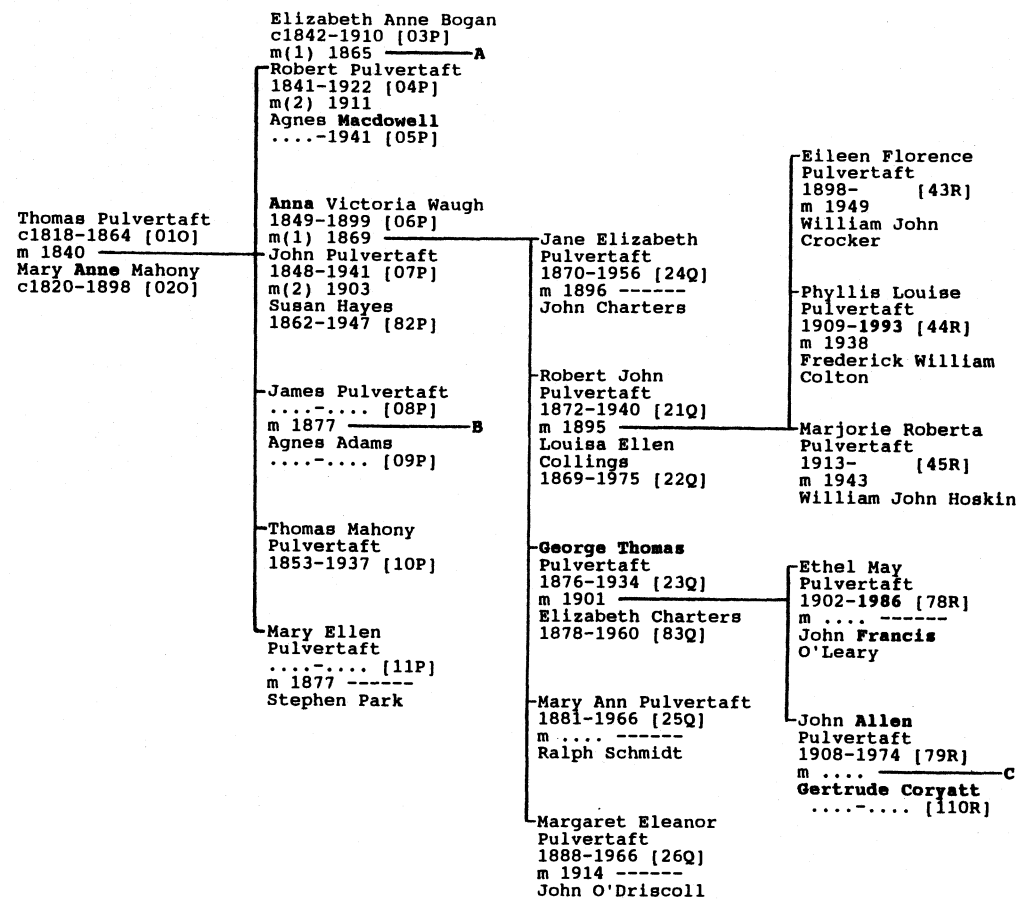
In this update of the modern Pulvertaft family tree, the same conventions have been incorporated as were used in the 1983 edition, namely:

- * Each member of the family has retained his or her unique number and generation letter.
- * Children whose father is or was not a Pulvertaft are not included but their existence is shown by a series of dashes after the marriage symbol.
- * Full Christian names are quoted rather than nicknames.

Additionally for this the 1994 edition, the year of birth and death are listed immediately after each name and the year of marriage after the symbol "m". Where these dates are not known they are represented by "....". New entries since the 1983 edition are printed in bold type; some because the material was discovered during the period, others because the event took place since 1983.

It will be seen from the bold entries that:

- * Several Christian names have been altered in recognition of what appears to be better data. It should be noted that there are sometimes differences of opinion on which is the correct version - e.g. Anna instead of Annie [06P] and Allen instead of Allan [79R].
- * Some early surnames have been corrected, others are new - e.g. Macdowell [05P] and Coryatt [110R].
- * Several new Pulvertafts have been discovered - e.g. Mabel [104R], Thomas Allen [108S] and Pamela [109S].

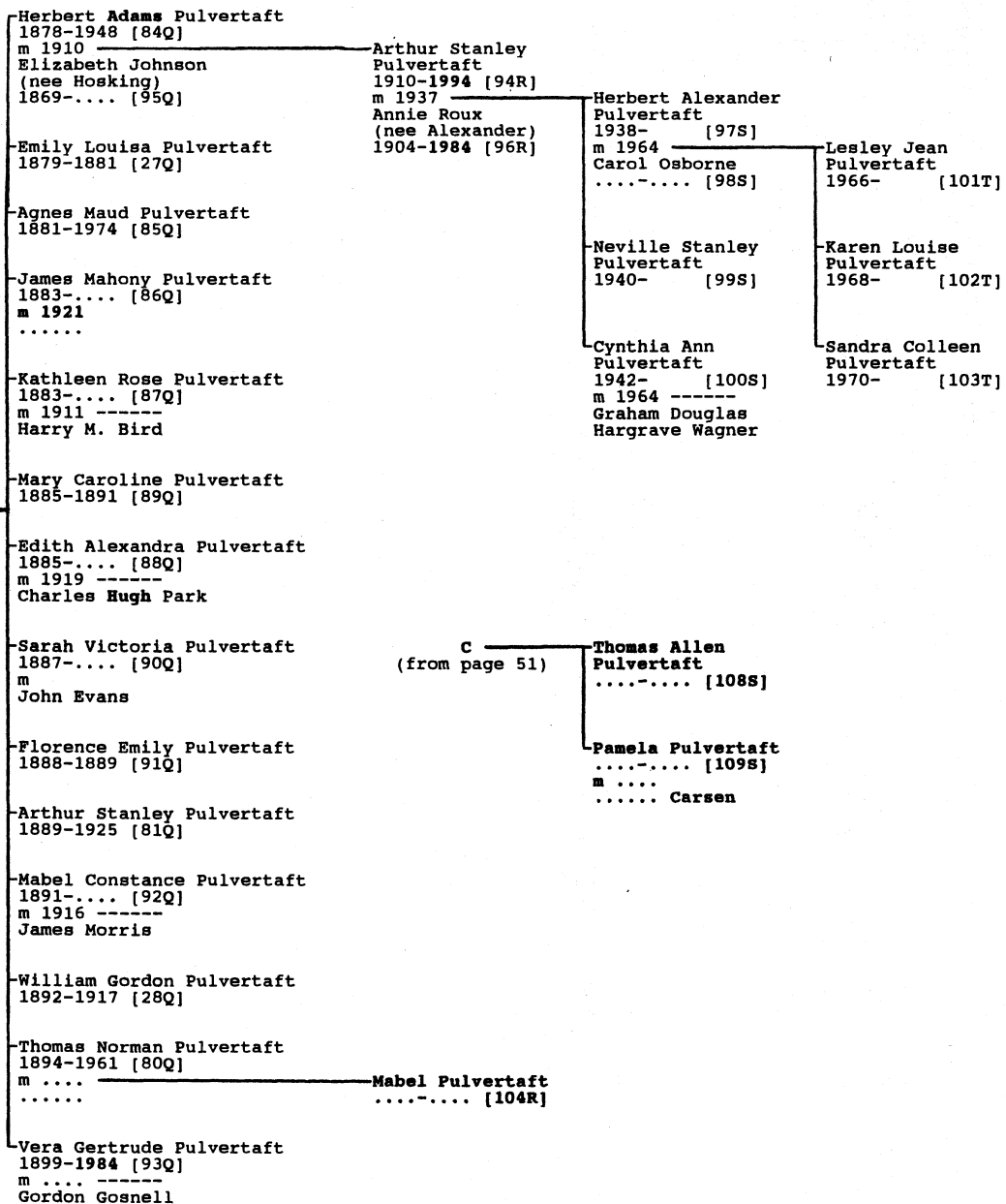

* The births, marriages and deaths which have occurred since 1983 - and which have been recorded individually in these papers - are now incorporated.

The most significant change to the tree since it was last printed is undoubtedly the inclusion of the year of an individual's birth, marriage and death, gleaned from many sources but principally from the General Register Office Indexes (PPs Vol 1, Nos 1-3) and the Irish Civil Registration Indexes (PPs Vol 2, Nos 8 & 9). Knowledge of birth dates has resulted in a complete rearrangement of the first generation of page 52 and the inclusion for the first time of James Bogan Pulvertaft - who must surely be the son of Elizabeth Anne (Bogan). Two other births in the Irish Civil Registration Index might well be of this generation but - with no supporting evidence - are not included this time. They are Richard Pulvertaft 1874-1875 and Richard Pulvertaft 1878-....

One entry which would have been a pleasure to have included is that of Robert William Pulvertaft - born Cork 1900 - who, as a Rifleman in the 18th London Regiment (London Irish Rifles) was killed in action in France on 5 November 1918; less than a week before Armistice Day. It would seem probable that he was the son of Robert George Pulvertaft and Mary Ladd, shown as "Laddie Pulvertaft [34R]" on page 52 - presumably a nickname derived from his mother's maiden name. More research will show whether they are indeed one and the same and whether Robert William Pulvertaft will be able to be given his rightful place in these pages.

The process of presenting such a concentration of information is bound to reveal that many readers know more detail of particular parts of the family than the author. Any additions or corrections would be most welcome.

NOTES & QUERIES

My thanks to those who helped me in my attempt to identify an old family photograph some months ago. It belongs to David Brunson - son of Fred and Grace (nee Pulvertaft) Brunson - who knows that it came from his mother's side of the family but not whether the subject was a Pulvertaft or a Denroche. [For an explanation, see page 52].

The photograph shows a woman of about fifty, wearing a black dress with white cuffs and a white bonnet. She is sitting on a balloon-back chair and is holding a book in her lap. The photograph is tinted, under a gilded wooden mount and in its original frame. The only clue to its origin is a label on the reverse which says:

Picture Frame Makers, Gilders, etc.,
33 Grand Parade, Cork.
A large variety of Mouldings to select from
Telephone No 815

The Cork Directories from 1906 to the present day suggested that the firm had probably moved to Main Street, Carrigtwohill; and so it proved. We made contact but found that, when the present generation took over the business, they had a clear out and now have no early records. Have any readers had similar difficulties and overcome them? If so, I would love to hear from you.
